#### **(4) Other classes in German from the Department for German Language and Literature**

Lectures can usually be attended as a guest student without any problems. In principle, seminars may be attended in principle, provided there are spaces and the lecturer is confident that the student's level of German will not be cause for problems.

#### **(5) Other courses in German in Business Economics, Political Science or Social Science**

Again, lectures can always be attended. Participation in other classes is in principle possible if there are enough spaces and the lecturer is satisfied that there is no language problem.

Furthermore, upon consultation with the respective lecturer, exchange students are free to attend classes in any other subject taught at the University of Duisburg-Essen. ## The IN-EAST Welcome Office

offers a range of services to our exchange students from China, Japan and Korea:

We have put together all relevant information in preparation of your stay in your own language.

We prepared guidelines in each language on how to make an online **reservation for a room in one of the dormitories**.

We put together your **personal learning agreement** so that you know where and when your courses will take place.

Before you arrive in Germany, **we assign a German student to you as your 'buddy'**. He or she will help you find the way to your dormitory and do the necessary paperwork, register with local authorities, enrol at the University and get your **student ID**, open a **bank account**, get **internet access** etc.

We also bring together overseas and German students for language learning ("**tandem partnerships**") and exchange on all aspects of studying abroad.

We work closely with people at your university's International Office in order to ensure that your stay in Germany is not only instructive but problem-free.

## Visa Process

**Visa type:** Either acquire a student visa before travelling to Germany or enter Germany by tourist visa (later status change to student visa). Assistance is provided via our buddy program.

**Necessary documents:** Passport, biometric passport photos (2), certificate of exemption of health insurance and certificate of health insurance (can be acquired in Germany), rental agreement of dormitory and "Vermieterbescheinigung", proof of finance (Blocked account with 861€ per month or scholarship), visa issuance fee (about 100€), certificate of enrollment of UDE.

**\*The proof for finance is subject to regular change (26.01.2022).**
