The World Bank Group Green Growth Program, Korea Green Growth Trust Fund (KGGTF) is seeking qualified short term Consultants to support KGGTF activities in Korea. The Consultant will be responsible for supporting a wide array of KGGTF work programs, including working with Korean Institutions, World Bank Staffs, especially in the Urban/Transport/ICT/Energy/Environment/Water sectors.

I. Background and Objectives

The World Bank Group's (the "Bank") mission is to leverage investments to reduce poverty, improve living conditions, and promote sustainable and comprehensive development in the developing world. The Bank's green growth efforts revolve around two core client objectives. First, countries perceive green growth as a means to enhance their resilience to environmental and economic shocks, about which there is increasing uncertainty due to climate change and other factors. Second, countries are most hungry for green growth strategies that enable job creation and poverty alleviation. The World Bank will promote green growth policies that explicitly account for the distributional effects of environmental measures and take advantage of any poverty-reduction co-benefit. To enable countries to implement these green growth policies, the World Bank also provides support to plan, design, and finance basic infrastructure that serves green growth objectives.

Transformational infrastructure projects are at the core of the World Bank Group's infrastructure strategy update, "Transformation through Infrastructure."

In many countries, a key challenge for designing and implementing green growth initiatives is to find practical examples of how green growth has been designed, learning from others who are facing these

decisions, and options for implementation. This type of practical south-south learning and peer exchange, when designed appropriately, serves as the one of the most effective capacity building efforts throughout the green growth design and implementation process.

The Government of Korea has agreed to provide a grant to partner with the World Bank to support World Bank clients on implementing green growth through practical knowledge sharing and support to results on the ground. The specific objective of the Korea Green Growth Trust Fund (KGGTF) is to scale up and strengthen the WBG's global green growth portfolio by leveraging knowledge and resources from Korea for World Bank Group client countries. This includes assisting developing countries to achieve sustainable development through practical knowledge sharing on green growth efforts, and develop informed knowledge base and capacity to implement green growth investments.

II. Tasks and Deliverables

The consultant will work closely with the KGGTF team carrying out responsibilities for a variety of operational tasks, e.g. technical/analytical sector work, KGGTF business development, knowledge and learning activities, etc.

1) Sector Work (Urban, Transport, ICT, Energy, Environment, Water)

- Support KGGTF in preparation and execution of Knowledge Exchange (KE) visits to Korea for KGGTF funded grants in respective sectors. This may include but not limited to drafting agendas, coordinating visits with counterpart institutions, logistical work and follow-up activities after KE visit.
- Identify and develop partnership with Korean counterpart institutions on green growth infrastructure field, specifically in respective sector.

2) Support to KGGTF Operations

- Contribute to KGGTF Knowledge Products Development in respective sector (i.e. KGGTF Progress Report, Knowledge Note Series, Case Studies Fact sheet, and others; KL activity presentation materials;)
- Other tasks on demand with flexible range of assignment, by guidance of the KGGTF team members.

III. Eligibility

- Undergraduate, Graduate Student or recent Graduate (graduated within 6 months) from schools identified by KGGTF based on the following criteria: candidates from local universities (excluding universities in Seoul) that has majored in specific sector-related subject to the trust fund operations.
- Level of Education: Undergraduate Level Rising Senior, Senior & Recent graduate
 Graduate Level (Master's or PhD) Curranty Student or Recent graduate

VI. Required Qualifications



- Good understanding of Urban, Transport, ICT, Energy, Environment, Water (at least one) sector issues is required;
- Knowledge, Learning and Communication Actively seeks knowledge needed to complete assignments and shares knowledge with others, communicating and presenting information in a clear and organized manner;
- Business Judgment and Analytical Decision Making Analyzes facts and data to support sound, logical decisions regarding own and others' work;
- Excellent written and oral communication skills in English; (Fluency in other languages is a plus, but not required)
- Works independently, seeking guidance on complex projects/issues from senior specialists.
- Proven ability to work under pressure, delivering quality work on time;
- Strong interpersonal communications skills;
- Ability to follow through on team priorities with minimum supervision;
- Proficiency in standard IT office applications (MS Word, Excel, Powerpoint);

V. Supervision and Timing

Duration of this consultancy will be for approximately 40 days. This consultancy may be extended based upon the team's operational needs at the time as well as satisfactory performance.

The consultant will report to Eun Joo Yi, KGGTF Program Manager, and will work on a day-to-day basis with other relevant staff as needed and relevant to the KGGTF objectives.
