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ACADEMIC CALENDAR

- **Fall Semester:** August 21 – December 8
- **Spring Semester:** January 8 – April 26

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- The equivalent of U.S. high school diploma or US bachelor's degree
- The undergraduate GPA requirement is a middle average score or 2.0 UG GPA
- Graduate GPA requirements vary by program
- Proof of English proficiency
- ACT/SAT exams are required for merit-based scholarships and direct entry into some undergraduate programs

COURSE REGISTRATION:

You will need to have access to your myMU account in order to register for classes. Go to mymu.marshall.edu and click the "First-Time Users" link. Set up your account with your name, birthdate, and the last four digits of your social security number. (International students use your MUID). Now you can set your new secure password. Then go to mymu.marshall.edu or click on the myMU shortcut on the upper right corner of the Marshall.edu homepage, enter your MUNet Username and Password, and click "sign in"

VISA INFORMATION:

Citizens of a foreign country who wish to enter the United States must first obtain an F-1 visa. You must have an F-1 student visa to study in the United States. Once admitted, you will receive an email from ISS with instructions on how to receive your Form I-20 Certificate of Eligibility. The I-20 will allow you to schedule your F-1 visa appointment. VACCINATION/COVID:

Updated vaccinations are highly recommended.

HEALTH INSURANCE:

U.S. Department of State requires that all international students have insurance in effect that covers students/exchange visitors for sickness or accidents during the period that they enroll for classes/participate in the sponsor's exchange visitor program. In addition, accompanying spouses and dependents of international students must also have insurance for sickness and accidents. Marshall University offers comprehensive health and accident insurance at affordable rates for international students through Insurance For Students, Inc.

HOUSING/ MEAL PLANS/ AIRPORT PICK-UP SERVICE:

International students who live on campus in the Twin Towers West or Twin Towers East (double occupancy) residence halls. There is a \$200 refundable housing deposit which is payable upon arriving to Marshall campus. Students who live in the residence halls are required to purchase a meal plan. You must pay the housing and meal plan fees before you can begin living in the dormitory or eating in the cafeteria:

IMPORTANT: You can arrive earlier, than the date of orientation, but there is a nightly housing fee for students who arrive prior to August 14th. The rate is \$30/night for a double and \$40/night for a single room. If you decide to arrive earlier, please indicate your arrival date on the housing application. Arrange for airport pick-up service and let us know your arrival plans by submitting the <https://www.marshall.edu/iss/arrival-form>.

We pick up from Huntington Tri-State Airport which is a 15-minute car ride or Charleston Yeager Airport, Tri-State Airport which is a 50-minute drive to campus.

CHECK-IN & IMMIGRATION SESSION

All new international students/exchange visitors are required to check in with International Student Services (ISS) upon arrival. Please plan to check in with ISS and attend a mandatory Immigration laws and policies session. The date, time, and location will be sent to students by email.
