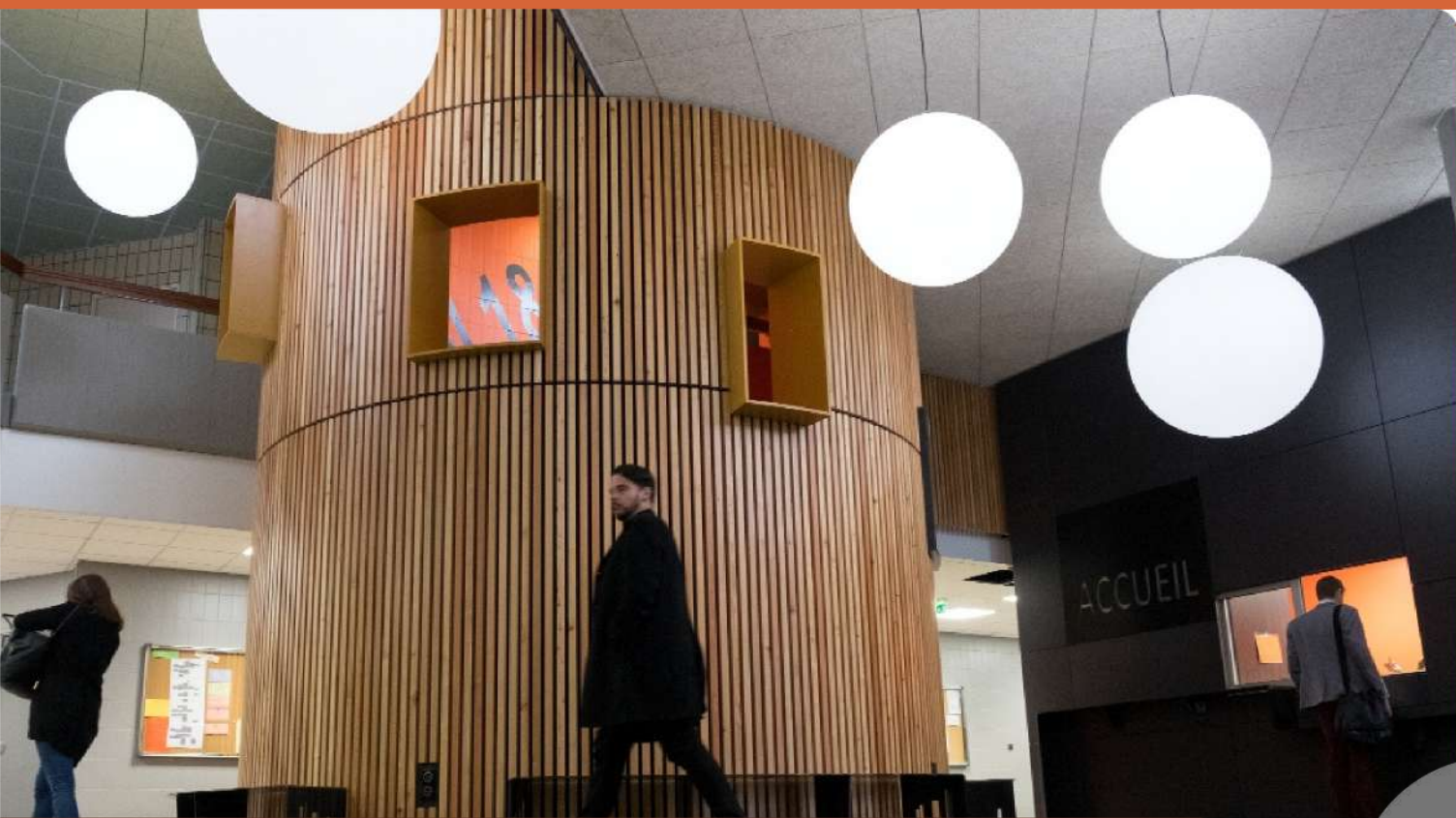

Application Document:

- 1 - Application form
- 2 - Current curriculum vitae
- 3 - Personal Statement to motivate the application (1 to 2 pages)
- 4 - Copy of passport

- 5 - Copy of transcripts of academic records
- 6 - Proof of proficiency in the target language (language certificate or letter of recommendation from language teacher)
- 7 - Learning agreement

Language requirements:

Ability to understand lectures and compose in the target language. B2* or equivalent in the target language at the time of application. Provide a language certificate or a letter attesting the student's level. Minimum B1 level for the programme "Humanités françaises" / "French humanities"

Language of tuition

French	Exchange students are expected to attend regular courses taught in French.
English	Limited number of courses taught in Management, Economics, Law, English Studies, Renewable Energy in Civil Engineering.

Course Credits

Minimum credit point	15 ECTS* per semester
Number of credit per year	30 ECTS* per year
Number of credits per course	1 to 7 ECTS* depending on the work load (3 to 4 ECTS* in average)
Lecture hours per credit	No fixed ratio. (3 hours in average)

Visa Requirements

- Non-European students staying in France for more than 90 days generally require a long-stay student visa. Depending on the type of visa issued, additional residence permit or visa validation procedures may apply upon arrival in France.

Administrative Formalities

- The international Office and its tutors assist and guide exchange students to do administrative formalities during the first weeks of their stay

Health Insurance

- Registration on etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr is mandatory and free. It covers 70% of medical fees, so getting a complementary health insurance is strongly recommended for full reimbursement.
- A "mutuelle" (€11-40/month) is strongly recommended for full medical coverage, obtainable either in France or your home country.
